

A REQUEST FOR SENSITIVITY

The events of September 11th, 2001 can bring up some pretty strong emotions. Please be patient and kind with one another. There may be people in this classroom who know someone who was directly affected or related to someone who was affected. If you need a break because it's too much, all you have to do is step outside the room.

I was in 7th grade and at school on 9/11/2011. Because I was alive and your age when this occurred, I remember a lot of details. It's a tough and emotional topic, which means a lot of adults don't always feel comfortable talking about it. Today is about learning a little bit more about this day in history and then focusing on the "helpers". Do not feel bad if you don't know all of the details about what happened. We are going to fill in some of the blanks today and highlight the people who made a difference in the face of tragedy.
