Compound Sentences

Step 1: Pick two simple sentences from the boxes below. (Each sentence can only be used once. Choose wisely!) Try to make as many as you can!

My dog is sleeping.	I did the dishes.
I made my bed.	It was snowing.
My glasses are dirty.	I am so happy.
It was cold outside.	I cut my hair yesterday.
I bought a new hat.	The milk was gross.
The movie was so good.	I had cereal this morning.
I hope I don't get sick.	l am hungry.

Remember that when creating a compound sentence, the two simple sentences must fit together

Step 2: Find the coordinating conjunction that fits best:

FOR, AND, NOR, BUT, OR, YET, SO

(these can be used multiple times)

Step 3: Type your compound sentences into the box below. Do not forget to add both a comma AND a coordinating conjunction.

Example: Batman is a hero. He helps catch criminals in Gotham City. Coordinating Conjunctions:FOR, AND, NOR, BUT, <mark>SO</mark>, OR, YET Batman is a superhero<mark>, so</mark> he helps catch criminals in Gotham City.
