

Compound Sentences

Step 1: Pick two simple sentences from the boxes below. (Each sentence can only be used once. Choose wisely!) Try to make as many as you can!

My dog is sleeping. I made my bed. My glasses are dirty. It was cold outside. I bought a new hat. The movie was so good. I hope I don't get sick.	I did the dishes. It was snowing. I am so happy. I cut my hair yesterday. The milk was gross. I had cereal this morning. I am hungry.

****Remember that when creating a compound sentence, the two simple sentences must fit together****

Step 2: Find the coordinating conjunction that fits best:

FOR, AND, NOR, BUT, OR, YET, SO

(these can be used multiple times)

Step 3: Type your compound sentences into the box below. Do not forget to add both a comma AND a coordinating conjunction.

Example: Batman is a hero. He helps catch criminals in Gotham City.

*Coordinating Conjunctions: FOR, AND, NOR, BUT, **SO**, OR, YET*

*Batman is a superhero, **so** he helps catch criminals in Gotham City.*
